From the Pastor

He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness."

So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me.

2 Corinthians 12:9

Grace to you, and peace, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ--

Last week I learned about *kintsukuroi*, the Japanese art of repairing broken pottery with a resin or lacquer mixed with gold powder. The result is that instead of concealing the break, the cracks and the flaws are turned into something beautiful, and the piece of pottery becomes a new creation because of the damage it sustained and the repairs made to it. The gold veins where the breakage occurred become a roadmap of the pottery's history.

This is what happens to people too, isn't it? Experiences of loss, of pain, of brokenness can't and shouldn't be just concealed. It's unfair to pretend that they never happened, or that we can somehow go back to being the people we were before they happened. We can feel whole again, of course, but we will never be the same.

If we extend the metaphor, the love and presence of God in Christ is the golden glue that puts us back together when we fall apart; that stands in the gaps of our brokenness and brings us to a new wholeness. As Paul wrote, Christ's strength is revealed in our weakness.

But this image of *kintsukuroi* doesn't just apply to individuals. It also describes the church in some ways. When Paul wrote his second letter to the church in Corinth, they were in the midst of a deeply divisive, painful conflict that was tearing the church apart. Instead of a rigid orthodoxy, he invites them to reflect the unity-in-diversity that makes the Church, the Body of Christ, unique among human institutions. He calls them to rely not on their own understanding or discernment, but on the grace of God and the strength of Christ's saving love; to stand at the limits of their own understanding and humble themselves before the

mystery of a God whose being and ways are ineffable. And there, at the limits of their understanding and strength, Christ's power will be revealed.

Christ is the glue that holds the church together. No one can deny that there are breaks and fractures, chips and gouges in the one universal Church that is the body of Christ. Some of these fractures are ancient and deep. Some are relatively recent and fairly superficial. But all of them are places where we are called to remember our shared brokenness and the unity that is God's gift to the Church.

As we approach a very contentious vote on the language that our *Book of Order* will contain about marriage at the Presbytery meeting on March 7th, I invite you to spend time in prayer, not for the vote to go a particular way, nor for the triumph of a particular "side," but for the church—our congregation, Presbytery, denomination, and for the Church universal—to bear witness to the grace and unity to which Christ calls us. No matter how this vote goes at the Presbytery and national level, there will be people who rejoice and people who mourn. We will be broken. I pray that the love of Christ will hold us together in our brokenness.

These themes of brokenness, healing, and rising to new life are what the season of Lent is all about. We will begin our Lenten observance on Ash Wednesday, February 18th, with a service of worship where we will remember our human limitations and finitude as we cast ourselves back upon the grace of God who created us. The season of Lent is an opportunity to deepen our faith, understanding, and commitment to discipleship. I hope you will journey with us through this season and beyond, into the joy and promise of our Easter faith. Opportunities abound, and all are welcome!


