### From the Pastor

*On the evening of [the day of resurrection], the first day of the week, the doors were locked where the disciples were, for fear of the authorities; then Jesus came and stood among them and said to them,...*

*“Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.”  
And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them,  
“Receive the Holy Spirit.”  
John 20:19-22*

Grace to you, and peace, in the name of our risen Lord, Jesus Christ--

The Easter season-- the fifty days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost-- is my favorite liturgical time of year. It's an exciting time, when we reflect on what it means to be and do Church; to be the body of Christ that bears witness to the resurrection. It's a time to celebrate new life, dream new dreams, and be renewed in our commitment to lives of discipleship. It's also a time to rest together in the gracious and loving presence of our risen Lord; to remember who we are and whose we are; to catch our breath, check our priorities, and take spiritual inventory. How well does what we do line up with what Christ calls us to do? Are we being the people (individually and together) that Christ calls us to be? Are we living lives of faith, hope, and love? Or, like the disciples after the resurrection, are we hiding these qualities behind walls of fear, anger, and doubt? When people from "outside" look at us, what do they see of Christ?

To help answer these questions, in the season of Easter and beyond, your session has designated the months of May-November 2015 as "A Season of Listening and Dreaming." We will be intentionally listening to you all and for the voice of God, and together we will seek to discern God's dream for Clarkton Presbyterian Church in our time and place. Soon you'll be receiving a letter that will describe this all in greater detail. Here, I simply want to highlight this as one particularly exciting way in which we're seeking to answer those Easter questions.

Another way that we'll be engaging with these questions of church, faith, and life, is by having Confirmation class. Confirmation class prepares young

people to *confirm* the promises of their Baptism by joining the church and committing themselves to the lifelong journey of faith and discipleship. But it's not just about the young people being confirmed. Confirmation is a joyous opportunity for us all to remember our baptismal promises and to recall what it means to be a member of the church. For me and those who will be helping lead the class, this is a great chance to revisit those things that are essential and foundational in our faith, to "get back to basics." The Christian Education committee will be meeting in the next couple of weeks to plan for the Confirmation Class, so more information will be coming out soon.

At a personal level, I'll be renewing my sense of call to ministry, developing skills to help me be a better pastor, and identifying growing edges, at the Presbyterian CREDO conference, May 12-18th. CREDO is an invite-only conference (and only 40 people are invited; which is to say, it's a pretty big deal!) conducted by the PC(U.S.A.)'s Board of Pensions that works with recently ordained pastors to build physical, financial, mental, spiritual, and vocational wellbeing. Based on the amount of pre-conference work I've had to do, CREDO is going to be a very demanding week, but everyone I know who has attended says it's completely transformed their ministry and given them new life in their calling. I'm really looking forward to this opportunity for development and renewal in my vocation, and I'm excited to share the things I learn with you all as I grow and mature in ministry.

The final thing to which I'd like to call your attention is sad, but no less an opportunity to reflect on a life of faithful service in the church. Mary McCall has worked for 48 years as the church's housekeeper; and while that is her paid position, she means so much more than that to this community of faith. As of the end of April, Mary will be retiring to spend more time with her family and to rest her weary body. Mary has worked REALLY long and REALLY hard here, and so we will be celebrating her and her many years of service in worship on Sunday, May 31st and at a covered dish luncheon after the service. I hope you can be with us on the 31st so we can let Mary know just how much she means to this church and how much we will miss her!

With all of these opportunities, how will you be and do Church in this season? How will you participate in our life as the Church together? As always, I'd love to talk through these questions with you. It's my great joy and privilege to be walking alongside you all as we journey together, ever deeper into faith and discipleship, seeking to be more fully the body of Christ in the world.

The stated meeting of the Session was held Sunday April 26. The minutes were approved. A letter was received from the Board of Pensions concerning the CREDO conference that Andy will be attending May 12-18 encouraging us all to be in prayer for him during this time. As a tangible demonstration of our support of Andy, see the special notice elsewhere in the newsletter that explains how we might participate. A motion to approve Andy's participation in an 18 month continuing education program for a certificate in Transformational Ministry Coaching through Presbytery was passed. This involves one day a month commitment. The personnel committee met twice in March. A motion to honor Mary McCall, housekeeper, on May 31, upon her retirement after 48 years of service was passed. If you are aware of possible candidates, please share with them. Alicia Smith will serve as interim housekeeper. On the calendar of special importance is the training, examination, ordination and installation of Allison Priest as Ruling Elder. We will be glad to have our table complete once again! The dedication of Ian's Tree will be held on Sunday, June 21, immediately following worship. Because of the busy month of May, business of the Session will be conducted as needed. The next stated meeting will be in June. As we know the needs of our congregation and the loved ones of our members are many. We encourage you to be in prayer for the concerns of which you are aware and also for those that are often hidden by a smiling face. We all stand in need of a tender touch of Grace.
